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Methodology

This bilingual poll of 1,000 likely general election Latino voters nationwide, was conducted from May 7th, 2019 through May 13th, 2019.

Interview selection was within predetermined census units of Hispanic adults. Half of these interviews were conducted online (50%), and the other half were conducted via telephone by professional interviewers.

Twenty-five percent of the interviews (249) were completed on cell-phones and the remaining 25% were conducted on landlines (251). Thirty-eight percent (38%) of all interviews were conducted in Spanish. Eighty-five percent (85%) of all respondents speak at least some Spanish. These samples were then combined and structured to correlate with actual adult Hispanic census population.

This poll of 1,000 likely general election Latino voters nationwide, has an accuracy of +/- 3.4% at a 95% confidence interval.

Major Findings

I. Political Environment:

1. The plurality of Hispanics say the economy is headed in the right direction 46%, only 43% say wrong track, and those who say right direction credit President Trump over Obama, 52%-38%.
2. The majority prefers free market capitalism, 59% to 20% who prefer big government socialism.
3. A total of 41% approves of Trump's policies, even though 19% may not like his personal style.

II. Latino Opinions on Immigration Policies:

1. Although 71% support legal status for undocumented immigrants, (and 22% oppose), the majority, 50%, agree that it is unfair to allow undocumented immigrants to jump the line over legal immigrants to get jobs and receive taxpayer funded benefits. Only 41% disagree.
2. Although 78% support giving undocumented immigrants a way to become US citizens, (and 16% oppose), 65% support tougher enforcement of the border to keep undocumented immigrants from coming into the US illegally. Only 27% oppose.
3. Approximately two-thirds, 65%, support e-verify, only 25% oppose.
4. The majority, 50%, supports strengthening the border to stop illegal immigration with a wall, police, surveillance drones and other measures. Only 42% oppose.
5. The majority, 50%, supports stopping undocumented immigrants from getting taxpayer funded food stamps, welfare, Medicaid and health care benefits. Forty percent (40%) oppose.

Major Findings

II. Latino Opinions on Immigration Policies (Cont'd.):

1. The plurality, 49%, support installing see-through steel barriers to secure the southern border and stop illegal border crossings. Forty-two percent (42%) oppose.
2. The plurality of voters, 46%, *OPPOSE* sanctuary cities that protect criminal illegal immigrants from law enforcement and immigration laws. Only 43% support.
3. The majority, 50%, *OPPOSE* abolishing the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement Agency also known as ICE. Only 37% support.
4. The strong majority, 61%, oppose a new law allowing late term abortions, while only 28% support. (They are 52% pro-life and 40% pro-choice).
5. A large majority, 73%, support securing the southern border with more law enforcement, drug detection at our ports, and closing loopholes that enable child smuggling. Only 19% oppose.
6. Forty-two percent (42%) support President Trump's immigration compromise for DACA recipients which would give 1.8 million illegal immigrants a path to citizenship in exchange for completing the border wall with Mexico and added border security, an end to chain migration, and an end to the diversity lottery system. Forty-four percent (44%) oppose.
7. The plurality, 46%, support ending the catch and release program where undocumented immigrants are caught coming into the U.S. illegally and released. Thirty-nine percent (39%) oppose.
8. Forty-six percent (46%) favor open borders and 45% say illegal immigration is just that—illegal.

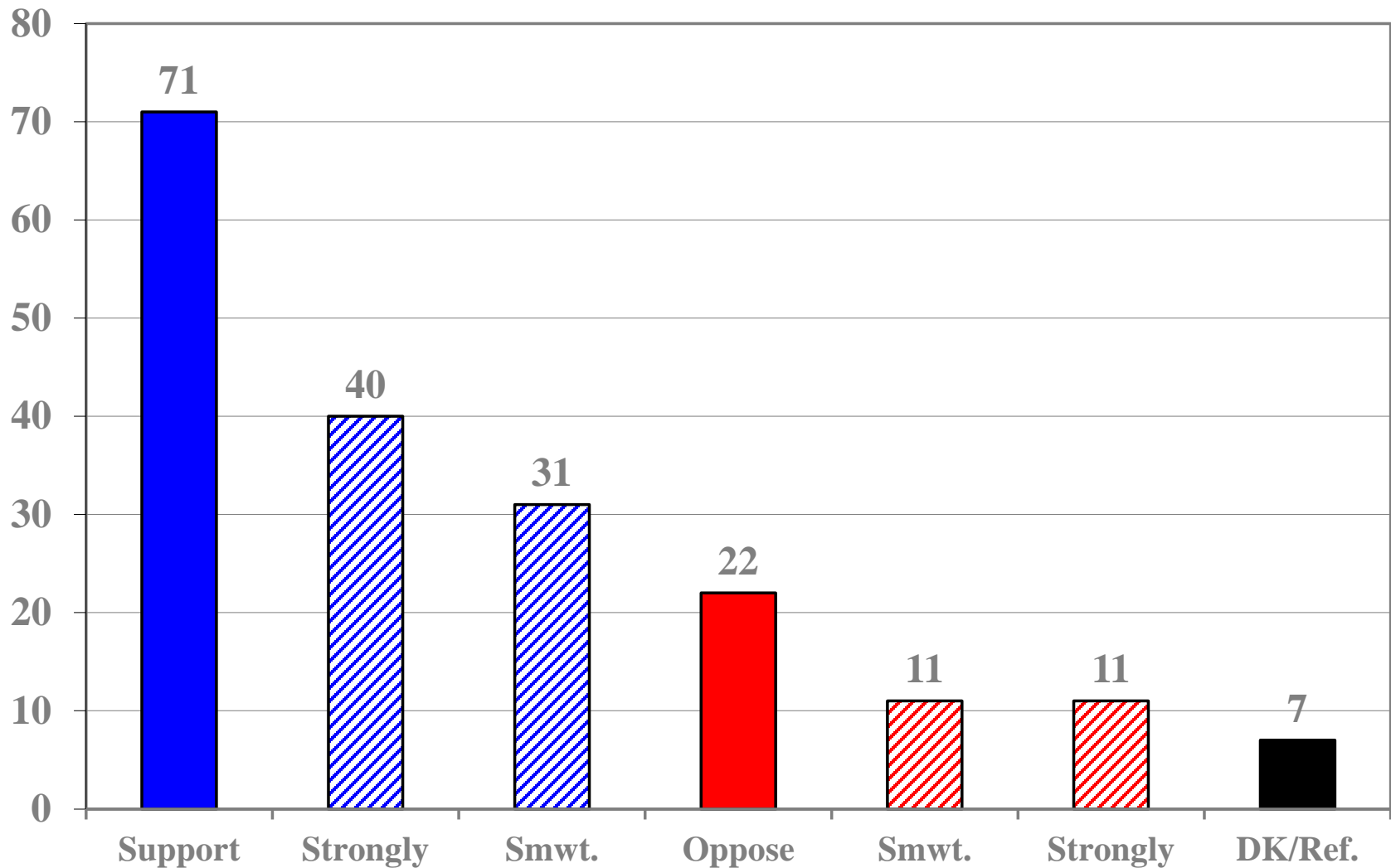
Major Findings

II. Latino Opinions on Immigration Policies (Cont'd.):

1. The majority, 55%, agree that U.S. is too crowded and can't fit everyone that wants to come here to live. We need to set stricter limitations on immigration and worry about those already here. Only 38% disagree.
2. The majority, 52%, support existing healthcare and only 36% support Medicare for All.
3. Eight-in-ten, 84%, support a guest worker program to expand the number of legal farm workers. Only 9% oppose.

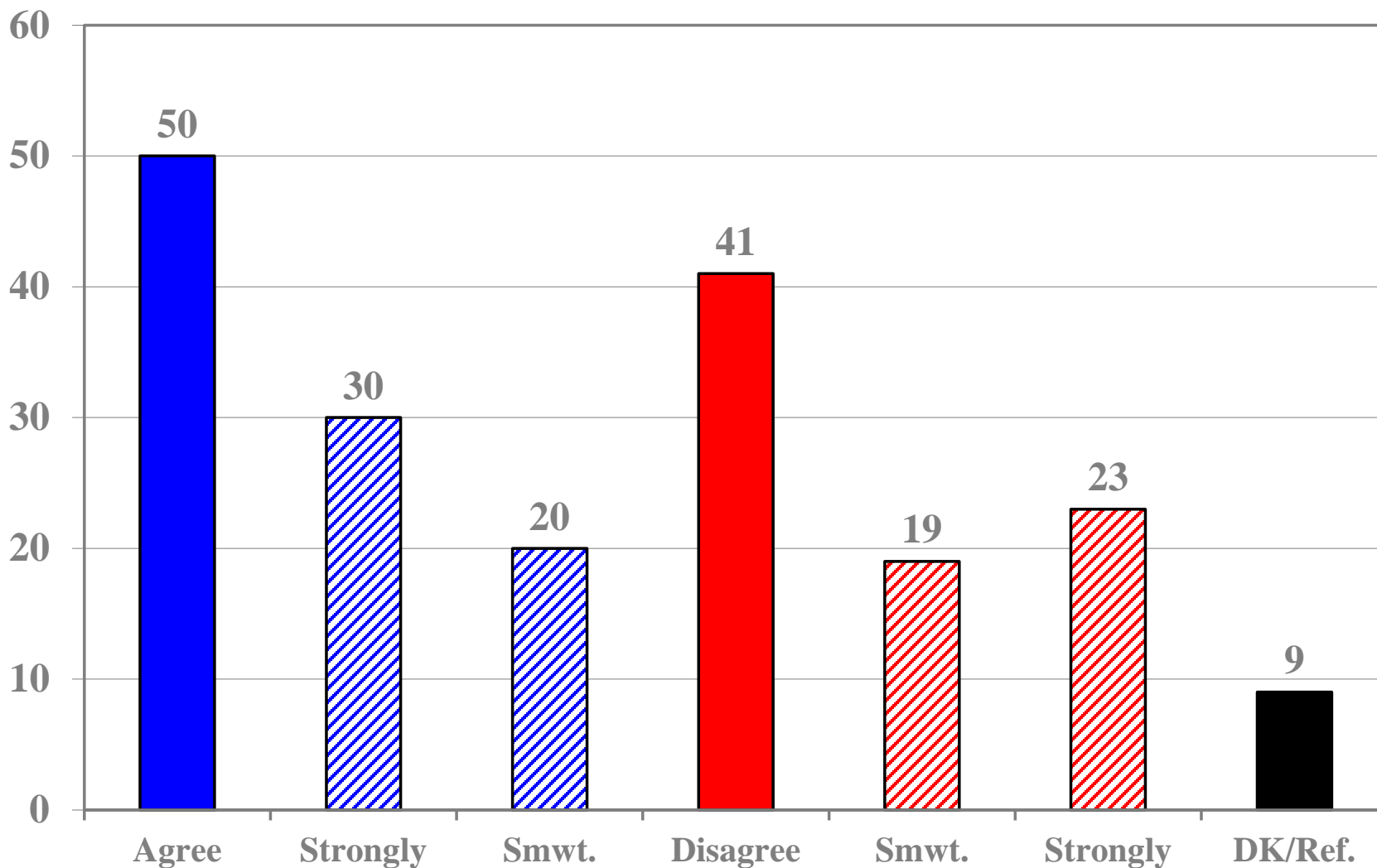
Immigration Policy Analysis

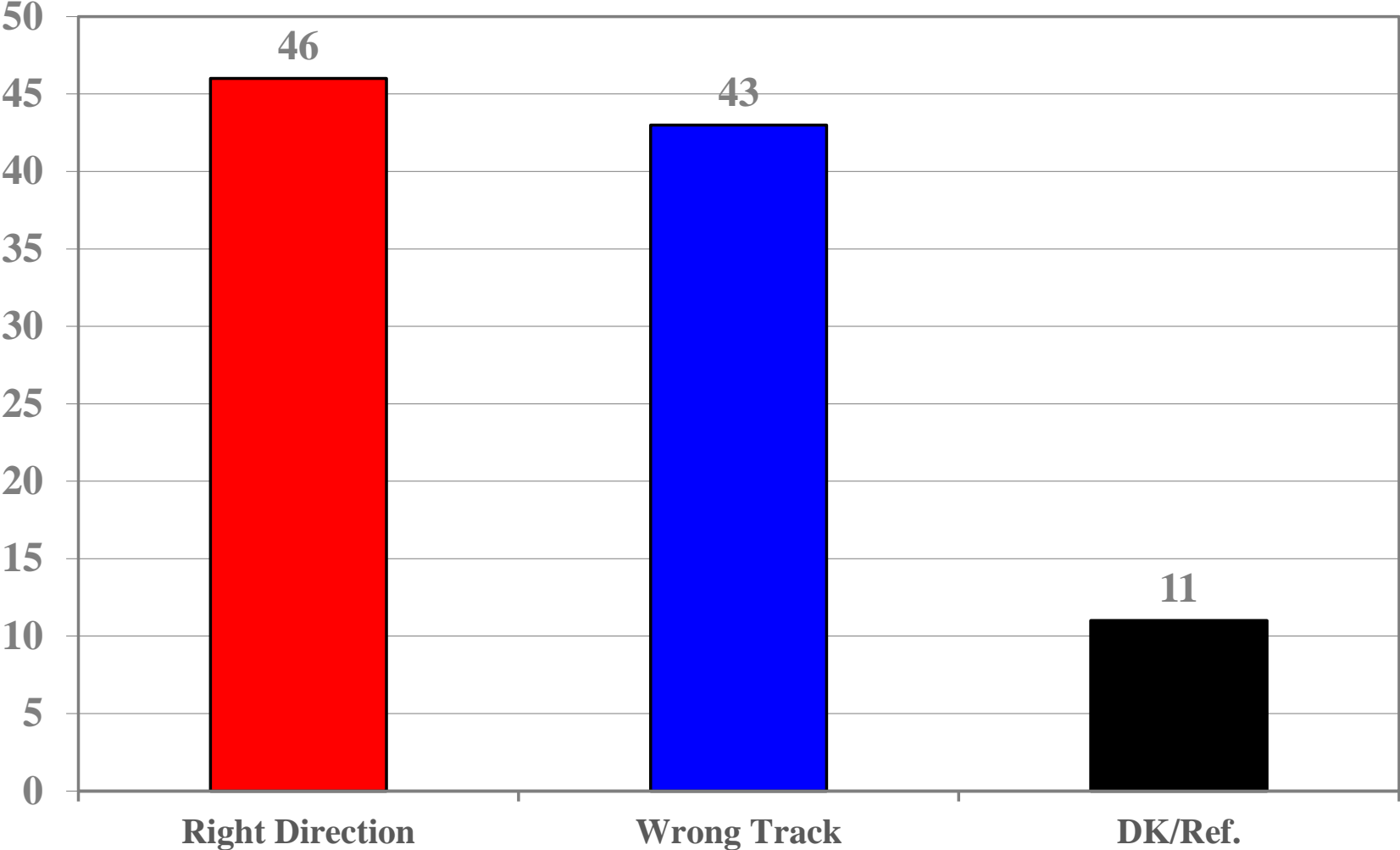

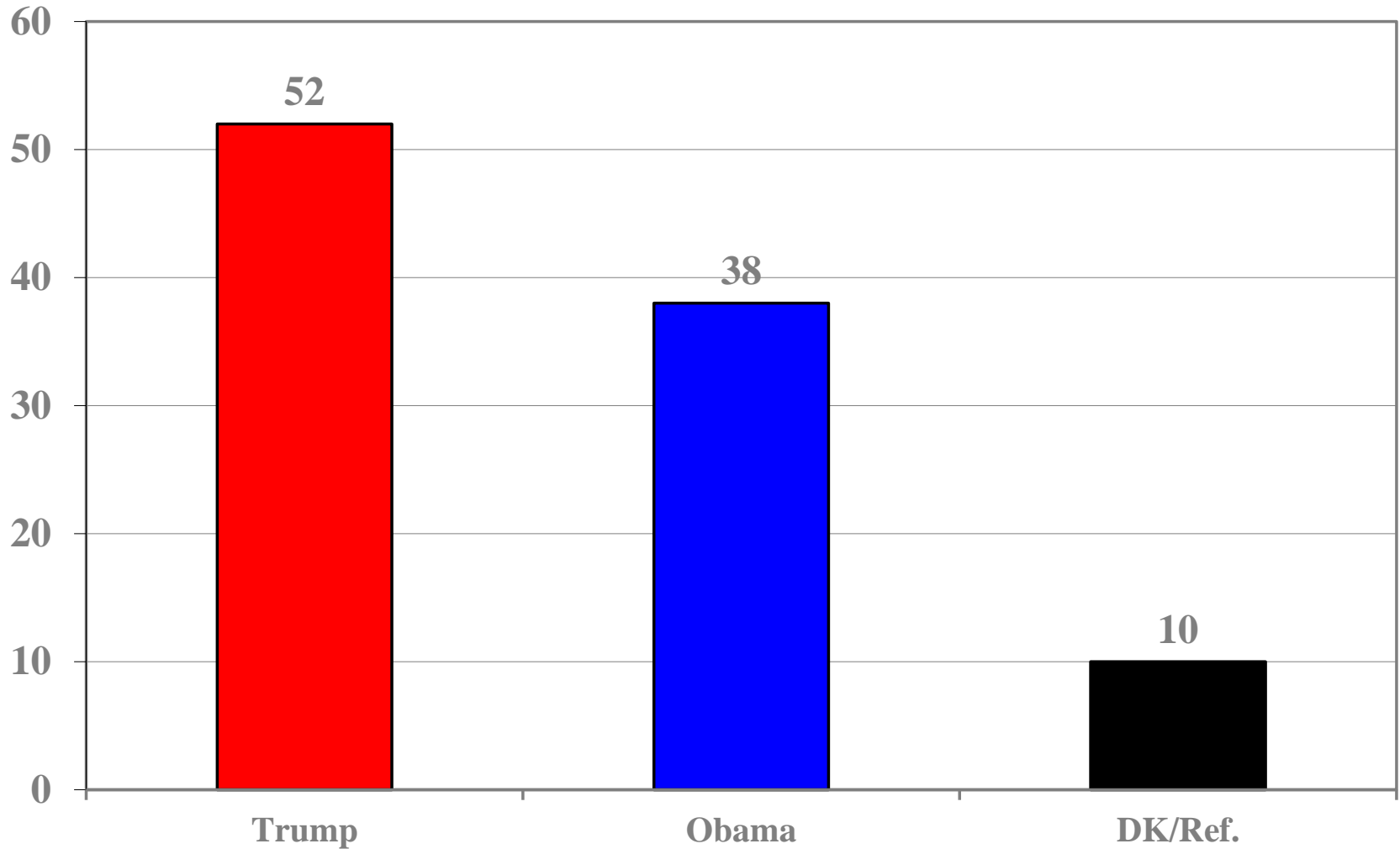
Direction of the Economy

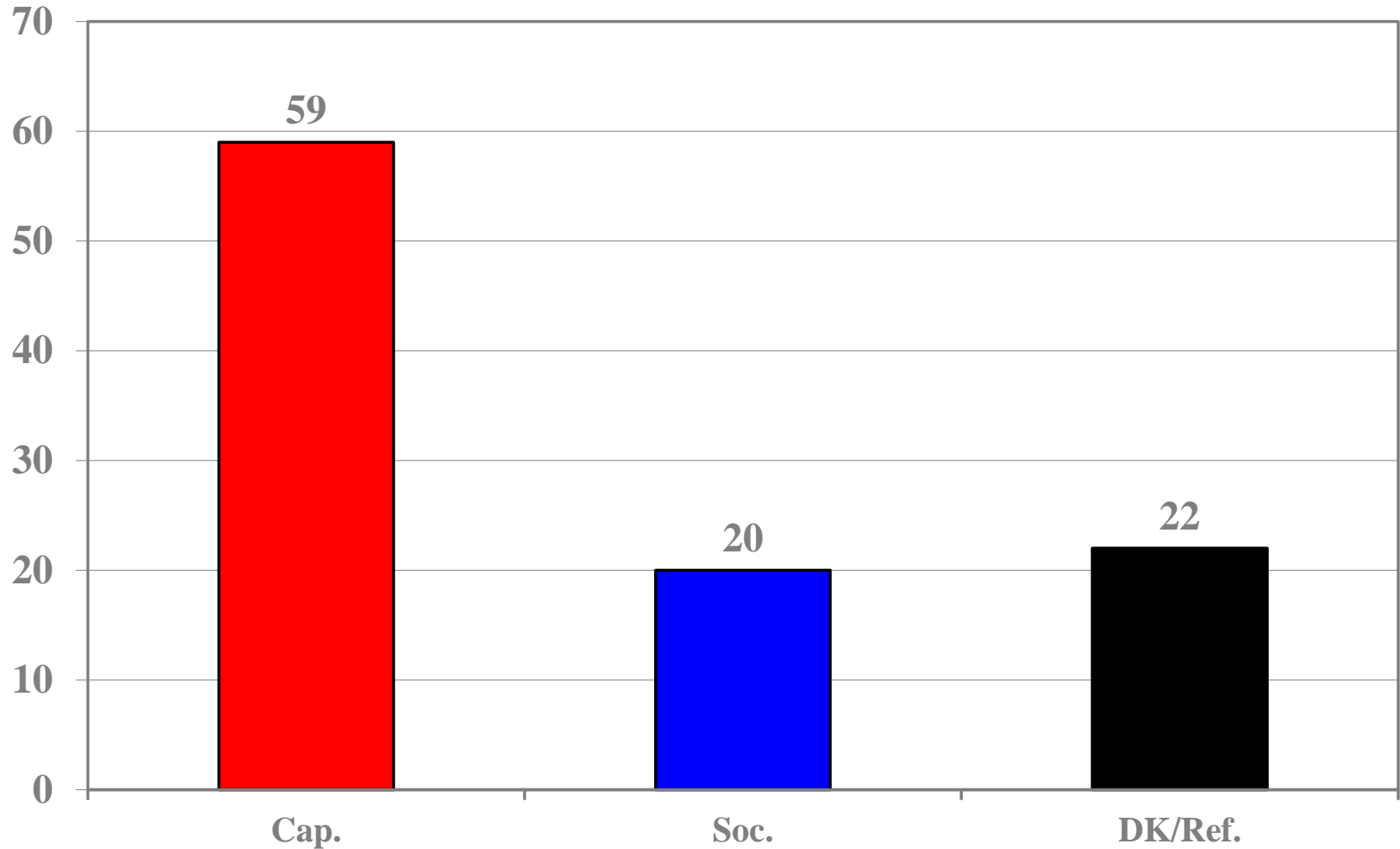
Who do you credit more with the current growing economy and millions of new jobs that were created?

Free Market Capitalism, *OR*, Government-Run Socialism



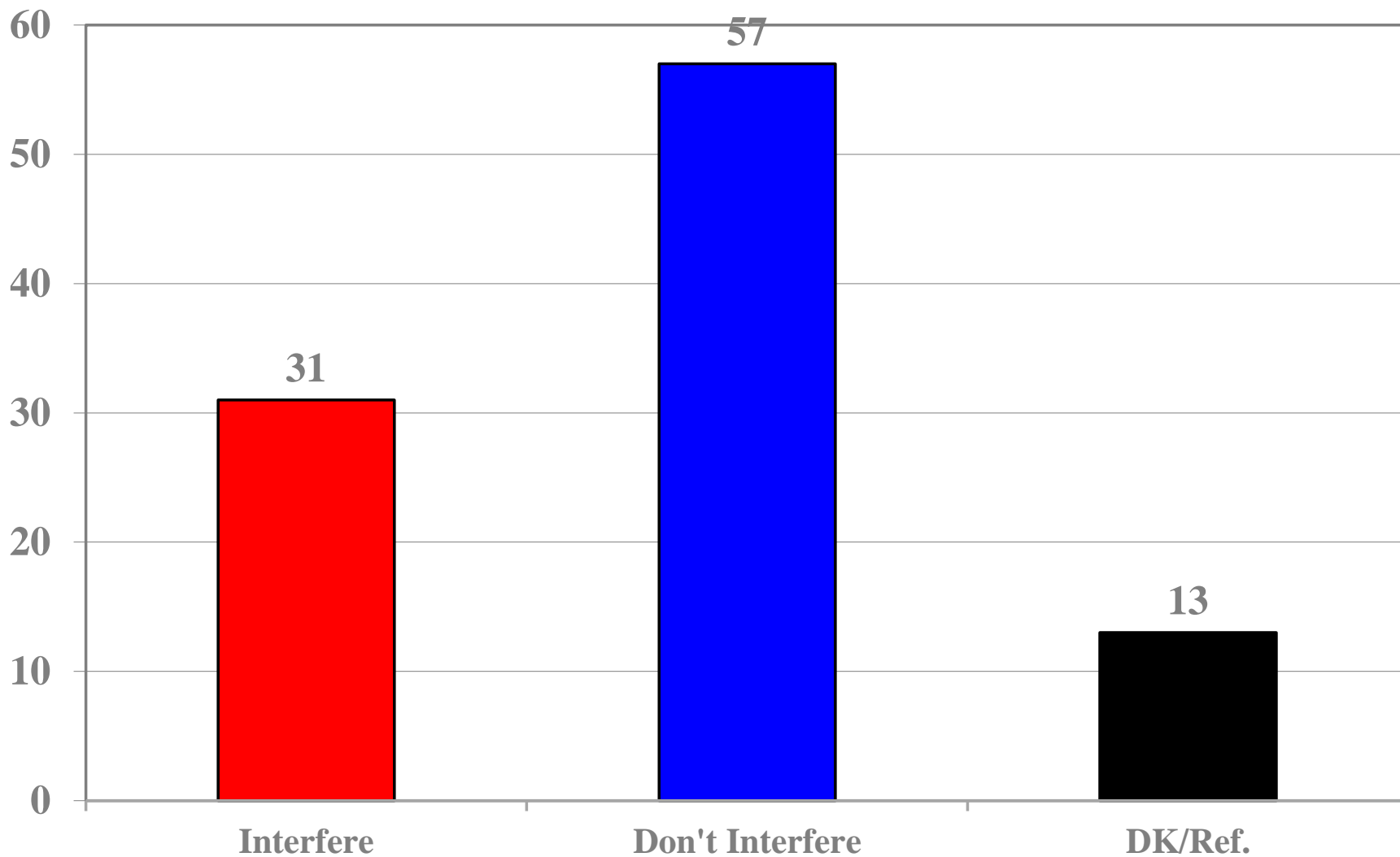
